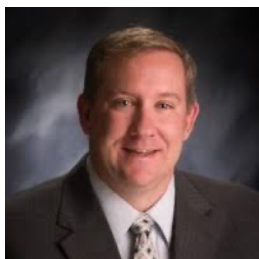

The **STEM GREENHOUSE PROJECT** is underway. Our new greenhouse is becoming a living STEM lab where students explore plant science, environmental systems, and sustainable agriculture through hands-on learning. As they grow flowering plants and vegetables, students will practice real-world skills in biology, data collection, engineering design, and problem-solving while learning how science connects to caring for God's creation. A supplement to the greenhouse includes growing lettuce and herbs in a hydroponic environment. A student team will visit the greenhouse daily until our spring sale which will be held early in May.

Over the past several weeks, our students have been busy with a **SERVICE PROJECT** assisting Trinity Lutheran Church by building a scale model of the facilities. With the help of Mr. Matt Parmenter and the use of his wood shop, the support of Mr. Mark Vogt, and the leadership of Dr. Boelter, students have been designing, measuring, cutting, and assembling the model piece by piece. Projects like this connect hands-on service with STEM learning as students



apply real-world math, engineering, and problem-solving skills—calculating scale, planning structural components, and working collaboratively to bring an idea from concept to construction.

FANTASTIC FRIDAY AT MAY MUSEUM

We were blessed with yet another fantastic Friday at LuHi! The day started with a field trip to the **May Museum** in Fremont, where students explored local history and learned about the people, places, and stories that shaped our community. Housed in the historic Dodge County Courthouse, the May Museum preserves artifacts and exhibits that bring the region's past to life and help connect today's students with the heritage of Fremont and Dodge County.
